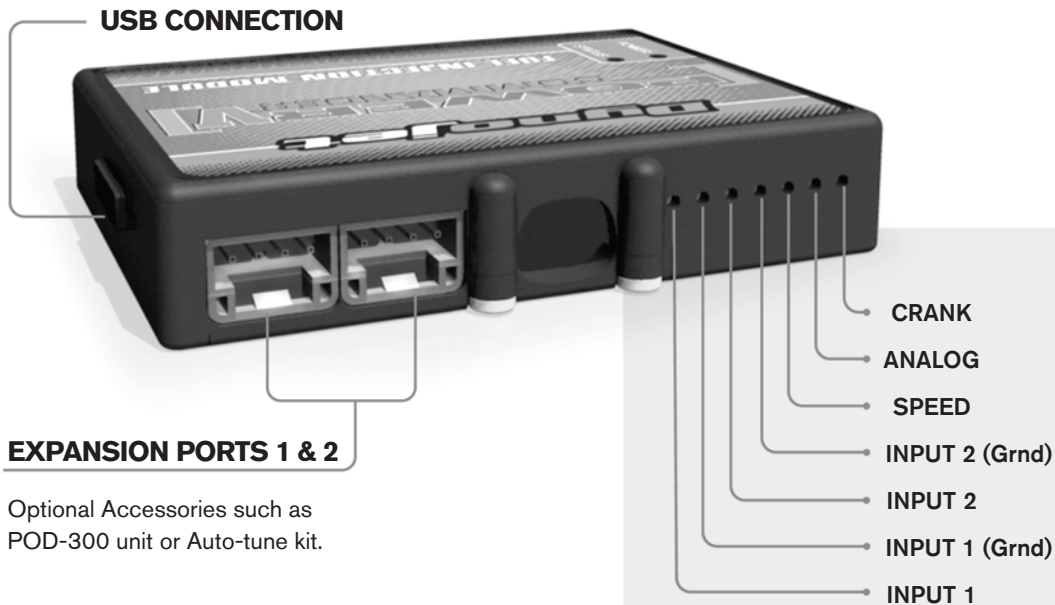

POWER COMMANDER V INPUT ACCESSORY GUIDE



Wire connections:

To input wires into the PCV first remove the rubber plug on the backside of the unit and loosen the screw for the corresponding input. Using a 22-24 gauge wire strip about 10mm from its end. Push the wire into the hole of the PCV until it stops and then tighten the screw. Make sure to reinstall the rubber plug.

NOTE: If you tin the wires with solder it will make inserting them easier.



ACCESSORY INPUTS

Map -

(Input 1 or 2) The PCV has the ability to hold 2 different base maps. You can switch on the fly between these two base maps when you hook up a switch to the MAP inputs. You can use any open/close type switch. The polarity of the wires is not important. When using the Autotune kit one position will hold a base map and the other position will let you activate the learning mode. When the switch is "CLOSED" Autotune will be activated. (Set to Switch Input #1 by default.)

Shifter-

(Input 1 or 2) These inputs are for use with the Dynojet quickshifter. Insert the wires from the Dynojet quickshifter into the SHIFTER inputs. The polarity of the wires is not important. (Set to Switch Input #2 by default.)

Speed-

If your application has a speed sensor then you can tap into the signal side of the sensor and run a wire into this input. This will allow you to calculate gear position in the Control Center Software. Once gear position is setup you can alter your map based on gear position and setup gear dependent kill times when using a quickshifter.

Analog-

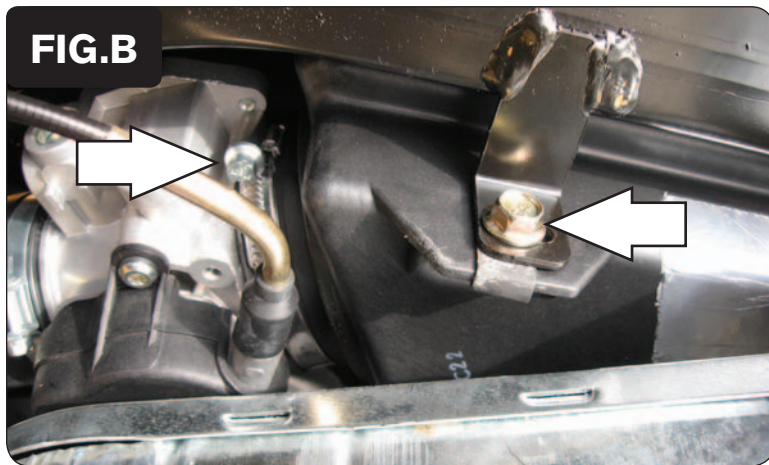
This input is for a 0-5v signal such as engine temp, boost, etc. Once this input is established you can alter your fuel curve based on this input in the control center software.

Crank-

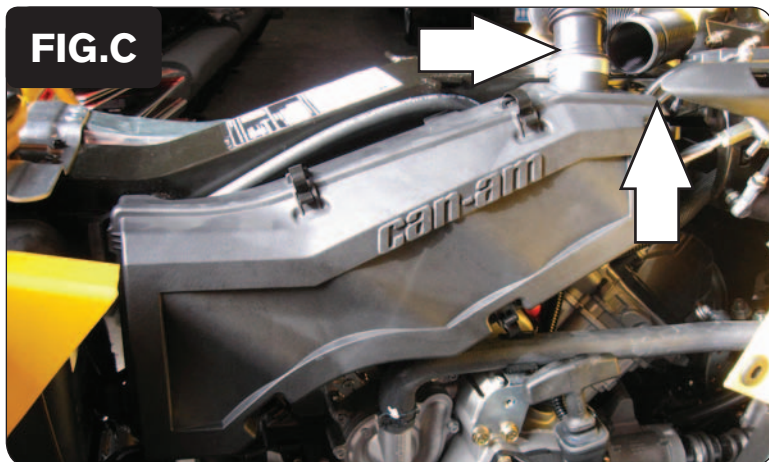
Do **NOT** connect anything to this port unless instructed to do so by Dynojet. It is used to transfer crank trigger data from one module to another.



- 1 Remove the seat.
- 2 Remove both side panels and the cover around the steering stem (Fig. A).



- 3 Remove the air box
- 4 To remove the air box loosen the clamp from the throttle body to the airbox and remove the bolt on the left side of the quad (Fig. B).

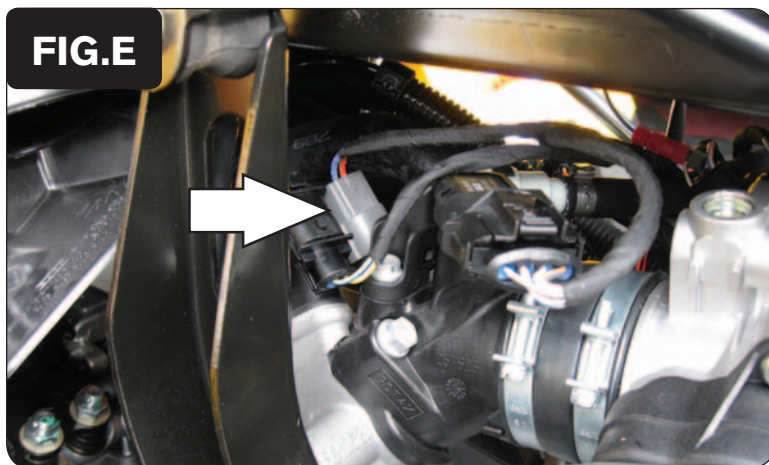


- 5 On the right side of the quad remove the bolts at the front and rear of the airbox and remove the intake tube (Fig. C).

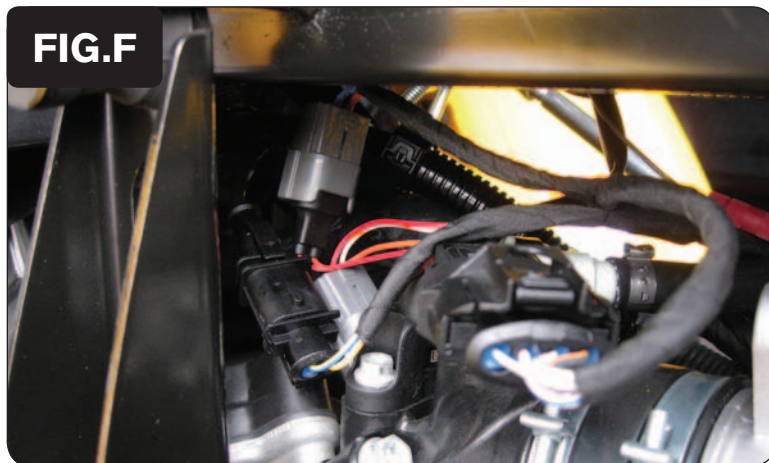


- 6 Install the PCV to the frame support near the shift lever (Fig. D). Use the supplied velcro to secure the PCV in place.

Make sure to use the alcohol swab to clean the surface before attaching

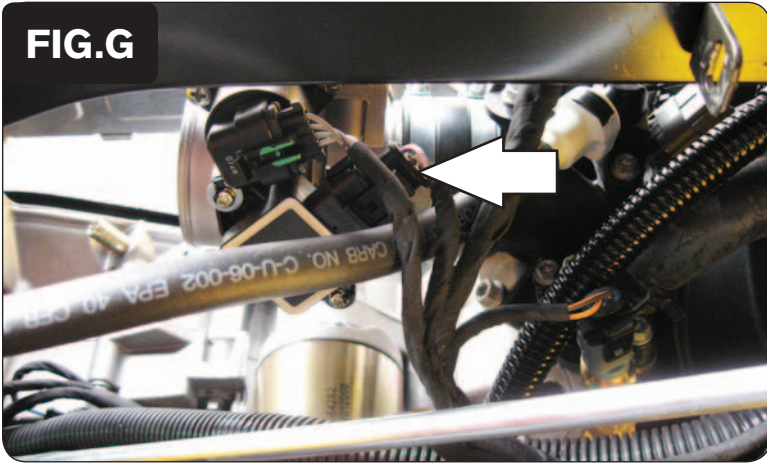


- 7 Unplug the stock wiring harness from the fuel injector (Fig. E).



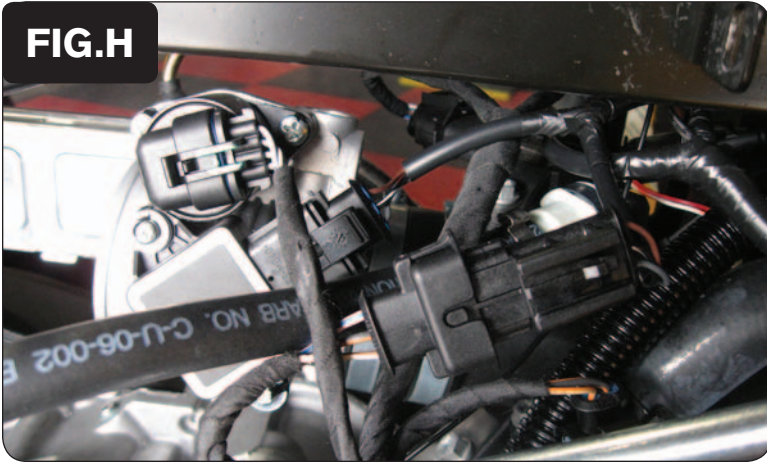
- 8 Plug the connectors from the PCV in-line of the stock wiring harness and fuel injector (Fig. F).

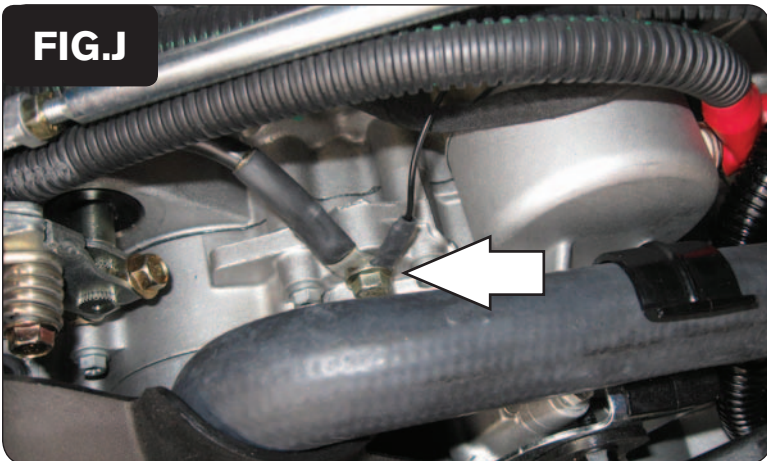
- 9 Locate the Throttle Position Sensor on the right side of the throttle body. Unplug the stock wiring harness from the TPS (Fig. G).

- 10 Plug the connectors from the PCV in-line of the TPS and stock wiring harness (Fig. H).

- 11 Attach the ground wire from the PCV to the engine case bolt (Fig. J).
This is the same location as the stock ground.
- 12 Reinstall the airbox and bodywork.
